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### I ADORE YOU HOLY CROSS!

## HIS MOST HOLY PASSION ON THE WOOD OF THE CROSS MERITED JUSTIFICATION FOR US



When we honor or exalt the Cross, we Christians are recognizing Christ Himself (Second Council of Nicea). The Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 617 says:

The Council of Trent emphasizes the unique character of Christ's sacrifice as "the source of eternal salvation" and teaches that "his most holy Passion on the wood of the cross merited justification for us." And the Church venerates his cross as she sings: "Hail, O Cross, our only hope."

With these first lines, we can see that devotion to the Holy Cross in the Church is of utmost importance since Jesus transformed an object of torture into an object of salvation. However, when did the cult of the Cross spread in the Church? Fundamentally, since the beginning of the Church, Christians have venerated the Holy Cross and it is for this reason that Saint Paul could say: "For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and a folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews ad Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God" (1Cor 1:22-24).



But this cult developed especially thanks to the discovery of Saint Helena, which we commemorate every year with the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross commemorates two historical events.

The first is the discovery in 320 A.D. of the true Cross, of Calvary, and of the tomb of Christ. Saint Helena, mother of the emperor Constantine, discovered them under a temple build to the goddess Venus where they had been buried by the Romans. The second event that gives rise to the celebration of this feast is the dedication of a church in that place in the year 335 A.D. Today, that church, which has existed since then, is called the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre and houses Calvary, the tomb of lesus, and the cistern in which Saint Helena found the instruments of the Passion of Jesus, including the Cross. The date of this discovery, according to tradition, was May 3, 326 A.D.

By interviewing many locals, and with the help of the bishop of Jerusalem, Saint Macarius, she discovered the place and found the Holy Cross that the Jews had previously hidden.

According to the historian Rufinus, the identity of the Holy Cross was confirmed by a miraculous healing after Saint Macarius recited this prayer:

"O Lord, who through the passion of your only begotten Son on the Cross, you deigned to restore salvation to humanity, and who even now have inspired your servant Helena to seek the blessed wood to which the author of our salvation was nailed, clearly show us which, among the three crosses, was the one that was raised for Your glory. Distinguish it from those that only served for a common execution. Let this woman who is now dying return from the gates of death as soon as she is touched by the wood of salvation."

The cross means both the suffering and the trophy of God himself: suffering, because on it He suffered a voluntary death; and the trophy, because in it the devil was mortally wounded and, with him, death was defeated.

The Cross seen from the outside is a symbol of pain and suffering, but its real meaning is a symbol of love and hope. The Cross is also called the glory and exaltation of Christ. It is the overflowing chalice of which the psalm speaks, and the culmination of all the torments that Christ suffered for us.

Thus we can realize the capital importance of devotion to the Holy Cross and how the discovery of the relics of the Passion has been possible. However, we must not forget that each of us has a cross to carry and that we are not alone on this path, Jesus shows us the way: "Then Jesus said to his disciples: 'If anyone wants to come after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross and follow me" (Mt 16:24).

There are many who, in our day and in the Church itself, experience fear, distrust or, at least, reservation in the face of obedience. But we must remain firm on the solid doctrine that Jesus has delivered to his Apostles, and to Peter in particular, as their head:

"You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church" (Mt. 16:18).

Jesus Christ created the Church and we know that he founded it in the best way. He, knowing Peter's rudeness, his faults and deficiencies, did not hesitate to establish him as head of the other Apostles. Those who today avoid obedience fear holiness. In short, they know that being a true Christian costs. They know that it is a serious demand and they shy away from the commitment to accept Christ in their lives. Within each fraternity of the Movement, this aspect of the value of obedience to those responsible for each of them is fundamental.

And it may happen that for this reason we lose friends, that people hate us and become angry with us. We do not have to fear if for this same reason we lose even important economic aid destined for the poor of the Third World.

All this will happen to us. But the important thing is to remain firm in the Lord, sure that He will help us. Nothing I'm telling you is anything new, because He Himself preached it to us:

«If the world hates you, know that it has hated me before it hated you. If you were of the world, the world would love its own; but because you are not of the world, but I choose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you. Remember the word that I said to you, 'A servant is not greater than his master.' If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you; If they kept my word, they will also keep yours" (Jn 15:18-20).

For the rest, based on my own personal experience, I tell you that until today mercy Divine Providence and have always compensated us beyond all proportion and measure. And each of you who have believed in this idea and have persevered in this spirit of holiness in obedience is the most evident proof of all this. Many of you, couples with children, young people, priests, seminarians from different nations, with different cultures and languages, also those who make up the Movement from any of its branches, on several occasions have proclaimed: "Father, we put ourselves at the complete disposal of the Servants of the Poor of the Third World and we want to of total in silence, spirit in а obedience."


